EARLY BIRD ENROLLMENT: All applications with \$350.00 deposit paid that are received prior to December 1st are Early Birds. Early Birds receive a free T-Shirt during camp.

REFUND POLICY: The registration deposit is refundable, except for \$100.00, until April 1st. Other fees are refundable until April 1. There is no refund for cancellations made after April 1st. No reduction in fee is allowed for late arrival, early departure, or dismissal.

WHO ATTENDS RIVERVIEW CAMP FOR GIRLS
Girls of good character and in good health, ages 6 to 16, are eligible to enroll. Riverview Camp reserves the right to refuse any application. **If your child has emotional or behavioral difficulties that inhibit her ability to interact successfully and safely in group situations you may want to consider selecting a camp environment that is designed to meet her special needs.** Our staff/camper ratio is 5:1, therefore, we do not have the staff available to offer 1:1 supervision. SPENDING MONEY ACCOUNT AND DOE SKINS T-SHIRT SHOP

You may include your child's spending money with the payment for the final balance DUE ON MAY 1st. Please itemize if you decide to do this. Charges such as Doe Skin T-shirt Shop, camp snack shop, and other expenses, (film, stamps, etc.) will be deducted from this account. **Fun Swim – No Lessons – Just plain fun!

We have 6 activity periods a day. Campers participate in the activities every day for the entire camp session (unless on a camp trip or Sunday). There is time for a shower in each camper's daily routine. Free Period is available as an activity slot for two week campers. This will also provide some limited free personal time for Rope Swing, Ping Pong, etc. Please discuss activity choices with your child. Most parents allow their campers to make their own choices. If you have specific activities you want her to take please contact the Program Director in writing before or on opening day of camp. There is also a place on the application for specific requirements or restrictions a parent may have for activities. If your daughter stays longer than 2 weeks she may change activities at the end of each Long-Term session if she chooses.

Limitations: Canoeing – Intermediate Swim Level (3 minute tread water test)

Riflery: 10 years old or older

Counselor-In-Training (CIT) Program: 13 - 16 years old. CIT's may sign up as activity assistants to learn leadership skills in favorite activities.

Working-CIT Program (WCIT): 13-16 years old (must apply for this position and be accepted in order to participate.) WCIT spaces are limited. WCITs attend camp for discounted price in exchange for "setting and waiting" tables during mealtime each day. No other discounts apply if accepted into this program.

VISITORS: Short or Long-Term Campers: Your cooperation is requested in strictly adhering to this policy. We do not have a Visitors Day. This enables our counselors to spend more time with their campers and allows the camp schedule to go smoothly without interruption. It also prevents mid-session homesickness! Parents, family members and friends are asked not to drop in to visit campers, pick-up laundry, bring gifts, etc. **ACTIVITIES / VISITORS FOR CAMPERS STAYING MORE THAN ONE LONG-TERM SESSION:** If your child is staying 3 or more weeks you may make arrangements through the office to visit at the end of the first long-term session. However, please make arrangements in advance because we do have special activities planned for them. We do not have a Visitor's Day – but will make special arrangements, if requested, for campers who are enrolled for more than one Long-Term session. Your cooperation is requested in strictly adhering to this policy. Please provide extra money for your extended-stay camper to go on one or several chaperoned trips to include a "Shopping Trip", movie and pizza between sessions. PLEASE UNDERSTAND, there may be extra expenses or charges to your campers account in the event of a planned chaperoned trip to a near-by attraction such as Sequoia Caverns, Rock City, I-Max Theater or Tennessee Aquarium. Extended-stay campers will be required to participate when such activities are planned.

ADMISSION – DISMISSAL POLICIES

The Camp is limited to girls of good character, between the ages of six and sixteen. For camp to be successful every camper must abide by the policies and procedures of camp and show a spirit of loyalty to and cooperation with camp management. Profanity or foul language of any type is prohibited. THE USE OF ALCOHOL, NON-PRESCRIPTION DRUGS OR TOBACCO, IN ANY FORM, IS NOT PERMITTED. The Directors will dismiss any camper or staff who violates this rule. In fact, we feel that SHE has "made the choice to go home" if she violates this policy. The Directors reserve the right to dismiss any girl or reject any application at any time if and when they feel it is in the best interest of the camp to do so. At camp there is no assumption to a reasonable right to privacy- i.e. we reserve the right to search bags, trunks, etc. of campers or staff to protect the safety and well being of our campers and staff. We reserve the right to confiscate illegal or unapproved items. Vandalism, violent or abusive behavior, or threats by campers or staff will not be tolerated. In the event of dismissal or withdrawal because of homesickness, misconduct, or any other cause, there will be no refund of camp fee and parents will be required to incur the cost of immediate transportation home. In the event of withdrawal because of illness requiring the attention of a physician, one-half of the unused camp fees for the unexpired portion of the term will be refunded. Aggressive behavior or "bullying" in any manner is also cause for dismissal.

INSURANCE: ACCIDENT INSURANCE is included in the camp fee. ANY DOCTOR OR PHARMACY BILLS INCURRED AS A RESULT OF ILLNESS WILL BE MAILED DIRECTLY TO THE PARENTS OR DEDUCTED FROM THE CAMPER'S SPENDING MONEY ACCOUNT.

LAUNDRY: FOR Long-Term (OR Extended-Stay) CAMPERS ONLY: Laundry is sent out once in a two-week session and is limited to ONE Laundry bag of approximately 12 pounds per camper. Campers' spending account will be charged for laundry over 12 pounds.

CAMP PICTURES: A free cabin photo & personal photo set is provided for each child.

RESPONSIBILITY AND SAFETY: Safety 1st, Fun 2nd is the principle we live by. Every conceivable effort is made to protect camper health and safety through staff training, constant inspection of equipment, and instruction to campers. However, the camp assumes no responsibility for accidents due to camper carelessness or for loss of personal equipment by fire, theft, or camper's carelessness. **In extensive surveys of camp safety, it has been determined that kids are "eight times safer in summer camp than in school."** We at Riverview take safety very seriously!

SUNDAY SERVICES: A Christian service is held each Sunday morning. Sermons and inspirational talks, made by counselors, staff, or guest speakers and musicians, provide long-remembered guidance for receptive young minds. Riverview is a non-denominational Christian camp and we endeavor to provide strong leadership within those principles.

CATHOLIC MASS: Campers of the Catholic faith may attend services in Fort Payne, Alabama, unless Sunday falls on an opening or closing day of camp. We provide chaperoned transportation to Mass.

TRANSPORTATION TO CAMP

Parents are totally responsible for the cost of transporting their children to Riverview. We do offer chartered buses from the Louisiana and Florida areas if a sufficient number of campers from the area reserve. Our chartered buses bring the campers directly to camp and are chaperoned by Riverview Staff members. In the past we have made chaperoned pick-ups at the Atlanta, Chattanooga, Birmingham, and Fort Payne airports. This policy may change depending on new airport regulations regarding departure and pick-up. There will be a ground fare pick-up fee if this service is available.

Riverview reserves the right to cancel any bus whose fees are not covered by reservations.

Parents are responsible for the full cost of transporting their campers to Riverview. As a service, we offer LIMITED chartered, chaperoned buses. Riverview Camp for Girls guarantees no alternate means of transportation should the chartered bus be cancelled. Charter Bus fees offset other travel expenses for a parent or guardian, saving them the cost of lodging, food, and gas. Campers enjoy the trip to and from camp with friends or meeting new friends! Baggage may travel on the bus, but must be limited to one footlocker (no oversized trunks) and one duffel bag or suitcase. Camper's name must be on the outside of each piece of luggage. **PLEASE SHIP any EXTRA BAGS SEPARATELY.**

BUS WILL TRAVEL TO CAMP ON THE DAY BEFORE CAMP OFFICIALLY OPENS. Our full camping staff will be on hand for their arrival. RIVERVIEW CHAPERONES WILL BE ON THE BUS AND WILL BE AVAILABLE TO ASSIST AT EACH CONFIRMED PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF STOP. Campers will need money for lunch on the day of travel. Snacks are allowed on the bus.

BATON ROUGE, LA 3rd & 4th Sessions only: \$225.00 EACH WAY

Bus departs at 7:00 a.m. from Marriott Hotel parking lot on College Drive just off Exit 158. Parent should arrive by 6:30 a.m. for loading. Bus will return to same place around 7:00 p.m. on return trip.

COVINGTON / MANDEVILLE, LA: \$195.00 EACH WAY.

Bus departs at 8:30 a.m. from Books-A-Million just off Interstate 12, Exit 12-B/Covington. Go Left at end of exit ramp. Books-A-Million is on the Right. Bus will return to the same place around 6:00 p.m. on return trip.

MOBILE, AL: \$180 EACH WAY

Bus departs from Whitney Bank parking lot behind the bank at the I-65 Dauphin Street Exit at 11:00 a.m. Bus will return to same place around 4:00 p.m. on return trip.

EVERGREEN, AL: \$170 EACH WAY (including Panama City, Destin, or Pensacola area campers)

Bus departs from Subway/Truck-stop (North Exit on I-65) at 2:30 p.m. Lunch break here on trip TO camp. Bus will return to same place around 12:15 p.m. on return trip.

MONTGOMERY, AL: \$155.00 EACH WAY

Bus departs from Cracker Barrel at the Prattville Exit # 181 at 4:30 p.m. Lunch break here on RETURN trip. Bus will return to same place at 11:15 a.m. on return trip.

BIRMINGHAM, AL: \$135.00 EACH WAY

Bus departs from Galleria (Belks) at 6:00 p.m. Bus will return to same place at 9:45 a.m. on return trip.

IF YOU'RE CHILD PLANS TO TAKE HORSEBACK RIDING CLASSES

For the protection of your child, riding boots or hard-soled shoes with a definite heel **ARE REQUIRED** for participation in horseback riding classes. Please pack them. Thank you for not putting us in the position of having to refuse your child the pleasure of riding because of lack of proper foot attire.

Shoes or boots which have firm, hard, coverings offer protection far beyond tennis shoes or other soft bodied shoes. A heel, which prevents the shoe or boot from sliding too deeply into the stirrup, can prevent the foot from becoming dangerously wedged.

THERE IS NOT AN EXTRA FEE FOR HORSEBACK RIDING CLASSES.

REST, FOOD AND HEALTH

An abundant supply of carefully prepared wholesome food, regular and adequate sleep and rest, and constant supervision all combined with vigorous activity produce a healthy camp experience.

Rest- Following our noon meal, all campers & counselors return to their cabins for a welcomed rest hour! This short rest renews our energy for afternoon and evening activities.

Food – A qualified Dietitian approves our menu plan. All meals are planned to provide essential nourishment for energetic growing girls.

Health Supervision- Two registered nurses are on staff to keep a close watch over every camper's health. Dekalb Baptist Medical Center is only 20 minutes away in Fort Payne, AL. 911 Service is available. We have a Physician on staff in some sessions, as well.

Health Forms- Health Forms are mailed in Feb. and must be returned to camp by May 15.

Health Forms are also available on-line if you need one before February.

Water- Drinking water is supplied from the city of Fort Payne. Pool water is filtered and tested daily according to state regulations. River water in which campers canoe and swim is tested regularly by the State Board of Health. Little River is classified as an Outstanding National Resource Waterway and has Federal Protection.

IMPORTANT NOTE ABOUT HEALTH FORM:

CAMPERS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO ENTER CAMP UNLESS A HEALTH FORM IS ON FILE WITH OUR CAMP NURSE. IT SHOULD BE RECEIVED BY MAY 15th.

BIRTHDAYS AT CAMP

Birthdays at Riverview are special. We provide a birthday cake in party fashion for the birthday camper and her cabin to enjoy. Please send a gift from home!

OUT-OF-CAMP TRIPS AND ACTIVITIES

Our program will involve some out-of-camp activities. We may take our campers by age groups to see Mentone's nearby beautiful brow and/or Desoto Falls. Some campers participate in overnight campouts. On extended Rainy Days we may take field trips to local attractions. During 3rd Session of camp we go to McCallie Sports Camp in Chattanooga for a Party. We also offer an optional "Trip Day" (More information on optional trips will be included in the Parent Information Packet mailed in April). **THERE IS AN ADDITIONAL FEE OF APPROXIMATELY \$175.00 FOR "TRIP DAY" – trips and prices will be itemized in the Parent Information mailed in April.** Transportation is provided along with proper supervision, meals and snacks as needed. The signature on your camper's application is considered as parental consent for out-of-camp trips and activities. **SOME TRIPS MAY BE CANCELLED IN THE EVENT OF LOW REGISTRATION FOR THE TRIP.**

Land Line/Cell TELEPHONES

Our telephone number is (256) 634-4043. We reserve our phone for business purposes and emergencies in the summer. Campers are not allowed to receive calls or call home. Parents are welcome to call our administrative staff if they feel we can assist with any situation. We're here to help! We are fully conscious of our great responsibility in the care of your child. In case of any emergency, either physical or otherwise, you will be notified immediately. Consequently, **WE DO NOT ALLOW PHONE CALLS EITHER INCOMING OR OUTGOING BECAUSE OF THE INTERRUPTION TO THE SCHEDULE AND THE EFFECT ON CAMPER MORALE.** We will make exceptions to this only in an absolute emergency. **Campers may not use cell phones. Please do not send them to camp.** Cell phones that are brought to camp by campers will be held in the Directors office until the last day of camp.

A SPECIAL NOTE REGARDING CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR CHILD

You will notice that our application includes a space for personal information regarding your child. We'd like to take a moment to talk about this issue.

Many parents are cautious about providing camps with information about personal aspects of their child's behavior or past experience. Some parents fear that the information may be misused, while others are concerned about their child being "labeled," singled out or treated differently. All parents want to see their child have a good start at camp, unencumbered by past problems.

As Camp Directors, who are ourselves parents, we appreciate these concerns. We also know how valuable such information can be in assisting us to help your child make her adjustment to camp as smooth and happy as possible - something we know all parents want, too! Very often having prior knowledge about a learning difficulty, a bedwetting problem, a recent loss in or out of the family, or a major change in the family or in the child's life can be the crucial factor in helping us to be sensitive to your child's need for patience, understanding and reassurance. Since children often automatically use their behavior rather than their words to tell us what's bothering them, having advance knowledge of areas that might be difficult for your child really helps us understand the message in her actions so we can assure her of a better summer.

If your child has emotional or behavioral difficulties that inhibit her ability to interact successfully and safely in group situations, you may want to consider selecting a camp environment that is designed to meet her special needs. Our commitment is never to misuse such information or to release it to unauthorized persons. It will never be used at camp unless necessary, and then only with the greatest of discretion. If you wish, we will inform you of any need to share this information with the staff members who are most in contact with your child, and will certainly let you know if your child is having difficulty. If you have any special concerns about this information or about your child, please feel free to call or write us. As a team we can better assure your child of a successful time at camp.

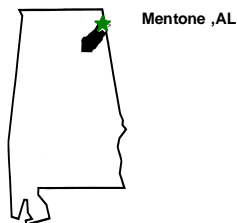

DIRECTIONS TO RIVERVIEW

Riverview is located in the Northeast corner of Alabama on top of Lookout Mountain!



Only 2 hours from Birmingham, Atlanta and Knoxville
Only 2½ hours from Nashville, 3½ from Montgomery
Only 1½ hours from Huntsville

BIRMINGHAM, AL

Driving time is 2 hours from Birmingham. Take I-59 north to **Exit #231** (Valley Head, Hammondville Exit). Turn right off ramp. Go ½ mile to **dead-end**. At **dead end** (there is a caution light here) turn right and then turn left onto Hwy #117 (another caution light here.) Bus Route: Follow 117 through Valley Head up the mountain to Mentone, AL. In Mentone at the blinking yellow light turn right, passing by Saint Joseph's Church. Go 2 miles to stop sign. Continue straight for ½ mile to Riverview entrance sign. Turn left at sign. Camp is 1 mile on left. Scenic short-cut Car Route: (NOT for Buses!) Follow 117 through Valley Head up the mountain...about half/way up the mountain – take a sharp right. At top of this scenic road, go to the right at yield sign. Continue straight for ¼ mile to Riverview entrance sign. Turn left at sign. Campus is 1 mile on left.

MONTGOMERY, AL

Drive time 3½ hours. Take I-65 to B'ham. Get on I-459 around B'ham picking up I-59 North toward Gadsden. Turn right off of Exit 231. Follow B'ham directions beginning with **dead-end**.

NASHVILLE, TN

Driving Time 2½ hrs. Take I-24 East to I-59 South into AL. Take Exit #231, turning left off ramp and follow the B'ham directions beginning with the **dead-end**.

Knoxville, TN

Driving time is 2 hrs. Take I-40 West to I-75 South to I-24 West to I-59 South. Stay on I-59 into AL to exit #231, turning left off exit ramp and follow B'ham starting with **dead-end**.

ATLANTA, GA

Driving time is 2 hours. Take I-75 North to Adairsville exit # 306. Turn left off the ramp towards Adairsville. Continue on Hwy. 140 about 15 miles to a dead-end. Turn right onto Hwy. 27 North to Summerville. In Summerville go through one traffic light, over the RR tracks and turn left on Hwy. 48 to Menlo. In Menlo at 4 way stop continue going straight on 48 up the mountain. From top of the mountain Mentone is about 11 miles away. During this 11 miles you will cross from GA to AL. At the AL State line Hwy 48 then becomes Hwy # 117. At blinking light in Mentone, turn left, passing St. Joseph's Church, go 2 miles to stop sign. Continue straight for ½ mile to Riverview entrance sign. Turn left at sign. Campus is 1 mile on the left.

HUNTSVILLE, AL – 1½ hrs.

Take Hwy 72 East to Scottsboro/Ft.Payne Exit. Turn Right off exit ramp. Follow to Hwy 35. Take Hwy 35 to Fort Payne to I-59. Follow I-59 North to Exit 231 (Valley Head, Hammondville exit.) Turn right off exit ramp. Follow Birmingham directions beginning at **dead-end**.
